Diversity in Education is a dual-qualification, practical training program that will equip you with the core foundation skills needed for success in training and employment, and the knowledge and skills required to work as a teacher aide or in other education support roles.

The training will cover topics relevant to the support of educators in primary schools. You will learn to support young students' individual literacy and numeracy development, contribute effectively to the management and organisation of a classroom, work with disabilities and cultural diversity, identify and supporting children at risk, perform required administrative duties and more.


The program is specifically designed for learners from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds who wish to provide cross-cultural learning support in diverse classrooms.

Elegibility Criteria

To be eligible for participation in the Diversity in Education program, you must be:

- a Queensland resident;
- aged 15 years or older;
- an Australian citizen, or an Australian permanent resident (including a humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on a pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen.

The Diversity in Education program primarily targets individuals who are:

- ineligible for Australian Government employment services or assistance (e.g. from jobactive or Disability Employment Services providers); or
- require complementary services because they have significant barriers to learning and employment; or
- have accessed Australian Government services (e.g., through Centrelink and/or jobactive or DES providers) for more than six months and remain unemployed.



We will assist participants through a tailored learner support program to complete the accredited training, develop confidence and overall job readiness, and help them look and apply for ongoing employment. Support program topics include:
